When else did a starburst spark the moment 430 acres of exhibits light the sky with 24 colors of neon tubing and spotlights like a t 9:15 pm May 27, 1933? Despite the poverty and crime, the fair organizers pressed on with attention to detail and creative networking. Then as the fair began, the Prohibition Act was repealed, and the Syndicate was squelched.

Not only did the 1933 Chicago World's Fair become the first 'modern' fair, financed by private business, but by 1934 Chicagoland itself enjoyed revenues reaching \$750,000!
